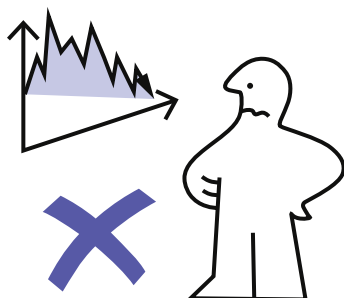
The best tip is to pick up the free tube maps they have at the station. it's a life saver to know how to use the tube and save your battery on your phone from having to check with no signal.

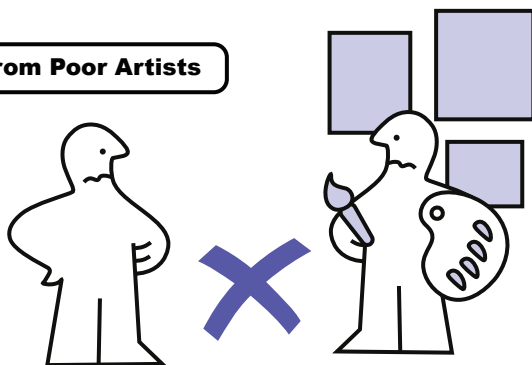
It's good to have an end goal for your life but not based on specific roles/requirements you need to set for yourself.

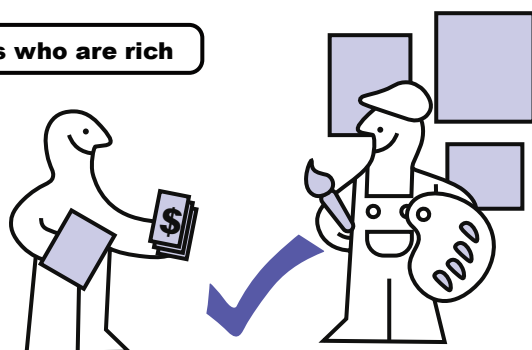

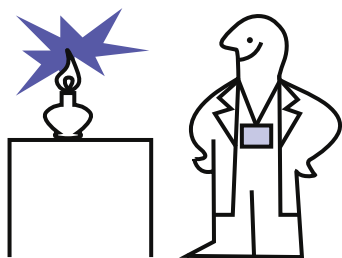
Rich people like to buy art from rich artist, cause artist who doesn't make money has a risk of needing a job, job means less time in studio and low quality of art.

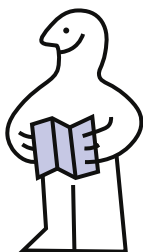
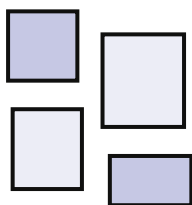
Due to Abesto's fire properties, it was greatly used in construction until 1998 they realised that it causes cancer, so let's remove it from the building during the demolition.

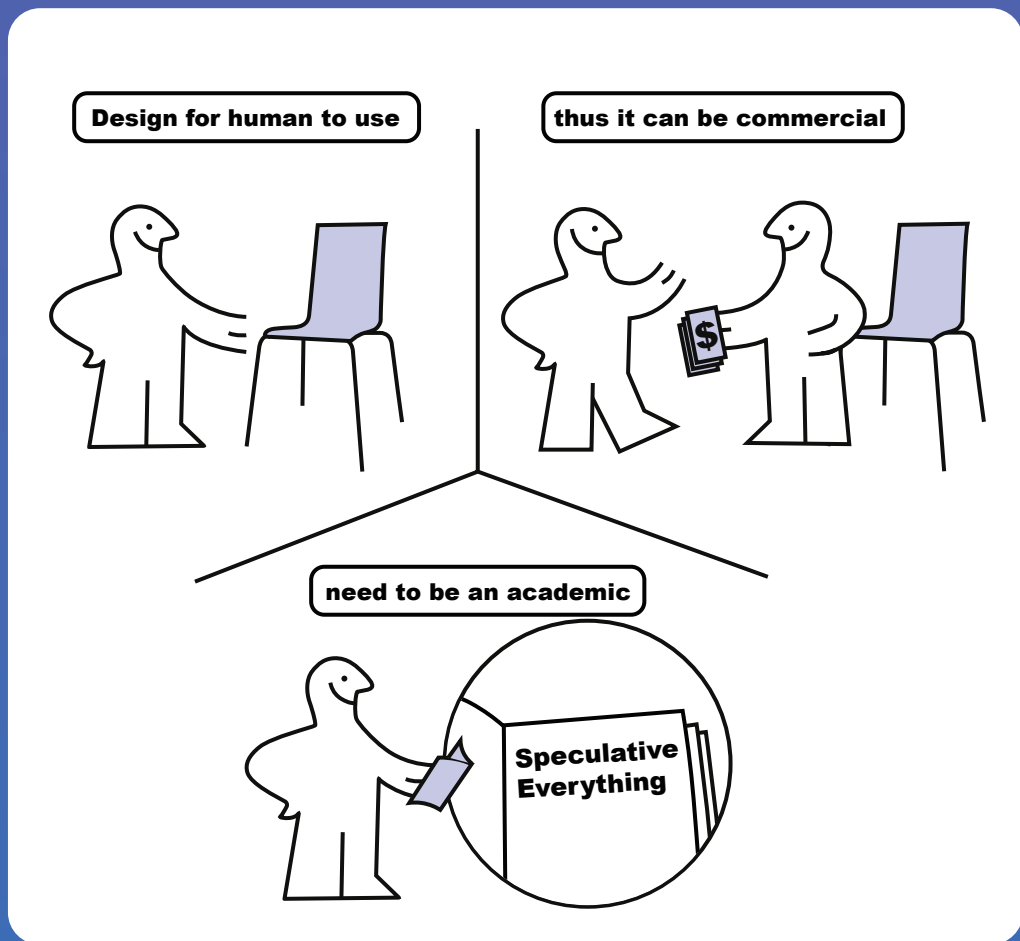
Make Fun Of Art

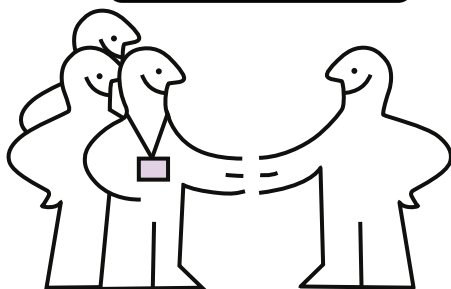

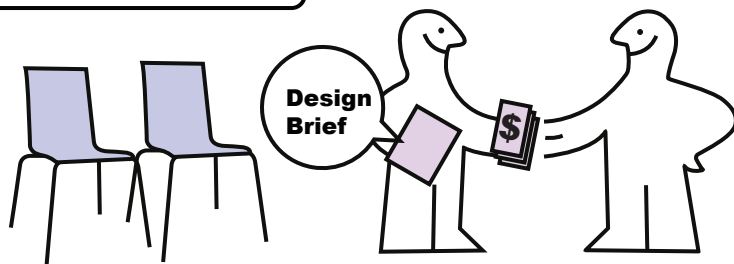
